LAUNCH OF 3D DIGITAL PROTOTYPING AND FASHION DESIGN PILOTING AT COC – KADOORIE

On November 5, 2025, Palestine Technical University – Kadoorie, in collaboration with Nablus University for Technical and Vocational Education, officially launched the piloting and training program for the 3D Digital Prototype and 3D Fashion Design courses.

The event took place at the Center of Competence (COC) for Fashion Design and the Manufacturing of Wearing Apparel – Kadoorie.

The meeting was attended by the 3DGarT local project coordinators: Dr. Mahmoud Jazzar, Dr. Samer Jarrar, and Mr. Samer Sabi, alongside the trainers, Ms. Susan, the fashion design team, and the participating students.

The objectives of the training program and course modules were presented and discussed. It was a particularly meaningful moment to reconnect with students following several weeks of closure in Tulkarem City, making the event both professionally and emotionally significant.





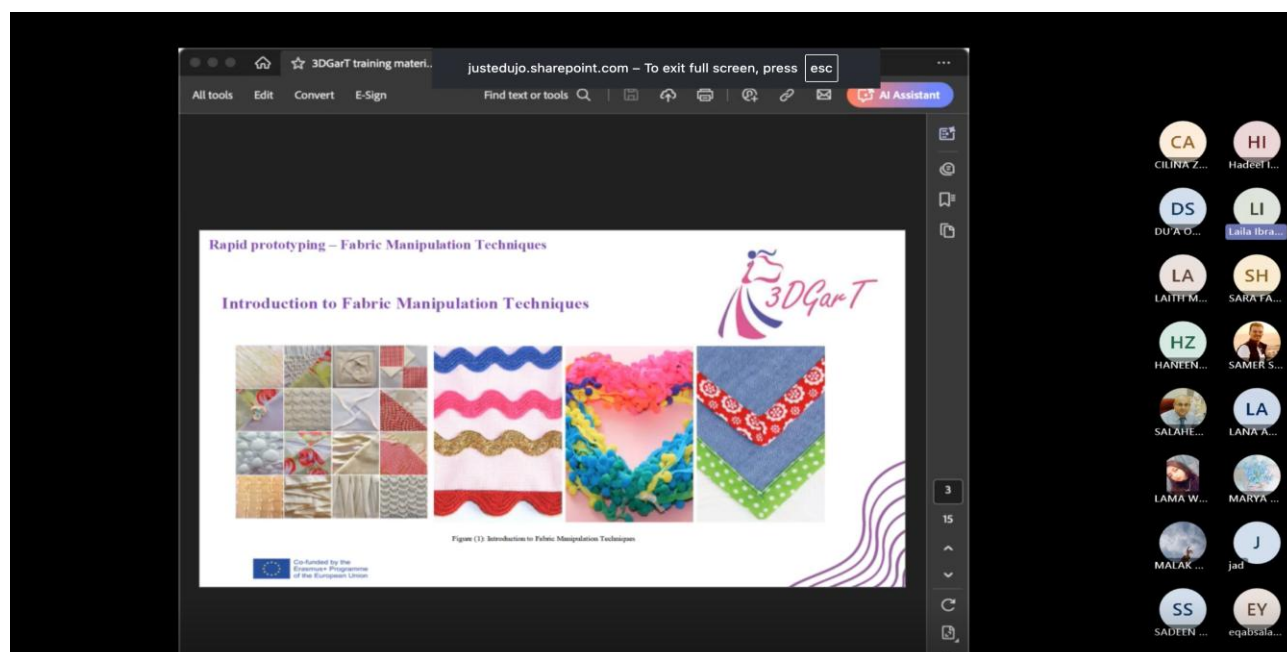
LAUNCH OF 3D DIGITAL RAPID PROTOTYPING PILOTING AT JUST

On 24 July 2025, Jordan University of Science and Technology (JUST) launched the piloting and training program for Module 5: Rapid Prototyping.

The piloting consisted of two sessions, each lasting 2.5 hours, during which all units of the module were covered.

The sessions were delivered by Eng. Samer Shatnawi and Dr. Laila Ibrahim, a faculty member at the Department of Architecture Engineering at JUST.

The piloting was conducted online via Microsoft Teams and was attended by approximately 23 participants, including students and employers.
